Mitsubishi Minicab Might Be The World's Cutest Fire Truck

There's even room for two people to sit on the outside.



Someone in Canada now owns the coolest, most adorable fire truck around. Before it crosses the Pacific to a new home, <u>check out</u> <u>this little life-saving machine on</u> <u>video.</u>

The Mitsubishi Minicab is a tiny workhorse of a vehicle in Japan. They're available in a variety of bodies, including vans and pickups, to fulfill a variety of commercial roles on the country's tight roads. This one features a

traditional cab and room for two more people to ride on a bench outside the vehicle. Farther back, there would usually be a pump for sending water to the fire engine, but the equipment is gone from this one. Instead, the new owner just has storage space back there. The Minicab complies with Japan's kei vehicle class, which limits the engine size to just 660cc. This little truck makes the most of its lack of muscle with a five-speed manual gearbox and a two-speed transfer case. If more traction is necessary, four-wheel drive activates at the push of a button. This setup in combination with the relatively light weight should make getting stuck a challenge.

The cabin also has controls for the lights and for external speakers,

including microphone connections for yelling at people along the road. Unfortunately, neither piece comes with this vehicle, but the new owner could get them going again. We'd love to know what the new owner intends to do with this little rig. It could be a neat purchase for a fire department looking to have some fun at parades. Alternatively, the Minicab still seems quite capable and could be a great tool on a farm where someone needs a little hauler but wants something different than a side by side.

Editor's note: I am well aware that Mitsubishi is not American made but it was too cute! I couldn't pass up this article!





Sopapilla Cheesecake Pie

Prep 15 m

Cook 45 m Ready In 3 h

3/4 cup white sugar

1/4 cup honey

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 cup butter, room temperature

Ingredients

2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese,

softened

1 cup white sugar

1 teaspoon Mexican vanilla extract

2 (8 ounce) cans refrigerated crescent rolls

Directions

- 1 Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Prepare a 9x13 inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2 Beat the cream cheese with 1 cup of sugar and the vanilla extract in a bowl until smooth.
- 3 Unroll the cans of crescent roll dough, and use a rolling pin to shape each piece into 9x13 inch rectangles. Press one piece into the bottom of a 9x13 inch baking dish. Evenly spread the cream cheese mixture into the baking dish, then cover with the remaining piece of crescent dough. Stir together 3/4 cup of sugar, cinnamon, and butter. Dot the mixture over the top of the cheesecake.
- 4 Bake in the preheated oven until the crescent dough has puffed and turned golden brown, about 30 minutes. Remove from the oven and drizzle with honey. Cool completely in the pan before cutting into 12 squares.

New USMCA trade deal would hurt U.S. auto production, boost parts production

Jobs gained in parts and engines, jobs lost in final assembly as cars cost more

The U.S. International Trade Commis-



sion estimated the proposed new North American free trade deal would modestly boost the U.S. economy but could reduce U.S. vehicle production. The economic <u>assessment of the</u> <u>U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement</u> (<u>USMCA</u>), released on Thursday, said the trade deal would increase U.S. real gross domestic product by 0.35 percent, or \$68.5 billion, on an annual basis and add 176,000 U.S. jobs, while raising U.S. exports.

The report's estimates are for year six of the trade deal, once it is fully implemented.

Auto industry employment would rise by 30,000 jobs for parts and engine production, but U.S. vehicle production would decline in and U.S. vehicle consumption would be reduced by 140,000 units, or 1.25 percent of 2017 sales, because of higher prices, the report said. Complying with new rules of origin and other requirements under the agreement would lead to small increases in vehicle costs.

The report found that 1,500 U.S. vehicle manufacturing jobs would be lost and the price of new U.S. vehicles would rise from 0.4 percent for pickup trucks to 1.6 percent for small cars.

The report may give ammunition to opponents of the deal. The leaders of the three countries approved the deal last year, but it still must be approved by the U.S. Congress. The deal is a replacement for the more than two-decade-old North American Free Trade Agreement.

The auto industry had been a key focus of the deal for the Trump administration. Some automakers may decide "not to offer vehicles that would be too expensive to bring into compliance, which would ultimately decrease consumer choice," the report said.

President Donald Trump has touted the deal as boosting the U.S. auto industry employment, which could be a key 2020 campaign issue in some battleground states. In February, he said at his State of the Union address that the deal would "ensure that more cars are proudly stamped with our four beautiful words, 'Made in the USA."

Study: European fully adaptive headlights better, should be legal in U.S.

Over in Europe and in Canada, some automakers offer fancy LED headlights that can selectively dim sections of the light to prevent glare while maintaining long-distance illumination elsewhere. And according to testing by AAA, these lights don't just sound good on paper, they offer greater illumination and potential for reduced glare over U.S.-spec lights.

In testing, the organization found that the adaptive lights provided 12.5 percent more high-beam illumination than the U.S. versions. In lowbeam mode, U.S. lights were better by just 1.9 percent. But the big advantage is running high-beams even with nearby cars, and AAA says that comparing U.S. low beams with the adaptive headlights running in normal high-beam mode, the adaptive lights can illuminate 86 percent more area ahead of the car. Perceived

glare from all lights were in the low range, and when going over hills, the adaptive lights usually caused less glare than U.S.-spec lights, though occasionally the adaptive lights were slow to adjust over hills.

So why don't we have these lights available? The Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS) code doesn't allow for low-beams and high -beams to be active simultaneously, which is required for adaptive lights to work. In addition, the government uses static tests for lights with brightness limits for low- and high-beams. Because adaptive lights only dim select areas, the overall brightness will be too high.

Considering the benefits of adaptive lights, it's no surprise that AAA feels that the government needs to change the regulations to allow

them. AAA isn't the only group pushing for European-style lighting standards, either, as Toyota, VW and BMW petitioned the government for revisions, and NHTSA is developing regulations that allow the lights. AAA supports NHTSA's move to permit adaptive headlights. It also has its own suggested changes such as more dynamic testing, including road tests. Additionally, AAA proposes upping the high-beam output limit from 150,000 candela to the European 430,000 candela, provided that the lights can start adjusting at the 400meter mark Europe tests the lights at rather than the U.S. 220-meter mark. The organization notes that the higher light power is a contributing factor to the European lights' better illumination.
