

In 1950, Mr. Wayne E. Town went on a blind date and ended up meeting the woman he would later marry. Their son learned respect for his dad at an early age.

Whether it was on a basketball court, softball field, golf course, or just playing cards, he was a competitive man and athlete. He had two hole-in-ones at the Sundance Golf Course, the first one being in 1976. In 2005, he was inducted into the Inland Empire Softball Hall of Fame. He still holds the record for left handed pitchers—16 strikeouts in a 7-inning game!

"This recipe from the Florida Keys has been given to almost everyone I know. It is the best marinade for chicken, and it only takes 30 minutes from prep till you can grill! It's a great blend of flavors with honey, soy sauce, and lime juice. If you have time, try marinating overnight for the fullest flavor."

Ingredients

3 tablespoons soy sauce

1 tablespoon honey

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

1 teaspoon lime juice

1 teaspoon chopped garlic

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

Directions

- 1 In a shallow container, blend soy sauce, honey, vegetable oil, lime juice, and garlic. Place chicken breast halves into the mixture, and turn to coat. Cover, and marinate in the refrigerator at least 30 minutes.
- 2 Preheat an outdoor grill for high heat.
- 3 Lightly oil the grill grate. Discard marinade, and grill chicken 6 to 8 minutes on each side, until juices run clear.







The tech already exists to electronically enforce speed limits on new cars

Big Brother is out there, but so far he's only watching



According to Leyre Olavarria, who heads up connected car technologies for the Volkswagen Group's Seat brand, all the technology needed for governments to electronically enforce speed limits on new cars already exists.

"From a technical perspective, it is possible. We can do it," Olavarria said in an interview with Autocar.

In fact, speed-limiting software already exists. Way back in 2008, Ford announced MyKey technology that allows speed restrictions based on the key used to start a vehicle. The system is aimed at parents who want to make sure their teen drivers aren't letting out their inner Andretti. And the Blue Oval's Intelligent Speed Limiter tech goes a step further by constantly monitoring speed limit signs and, if engaged,

automatically restricting a vehicle to that government-mandated velocity.

Ford isn't the only automaker introduce speed-limiting technology. GPS speed data and camera systems on-car widely available, and some automakers, including Audi, already have various implementations of the tech in use. These systems prove that Olavarria's statements accurate.

Fortunately, use of speedlimiting technologies has always been voluntary. And it's likely to stay that way for the foreseeable future.

"It's more a legal issue; how do regulators want to position themselves," Olavarria says. So, before you get too upset about the prospect that the government might step in the way of your speed-addled driving fun (or preventing you from accelerating to avoid an accident), know that there are obvious legal and political issues standing in the way of that kind of policy.

Still, while it might seem farfetched that a city, state, or entire country would call for the implementation of electronic speed-limiting technology, the fact of the matter is that modern cars are basically that rolling computers constantly monitoring storing all sorts of data including average and top speeds. What's more, some monitoring systems, including one that would alert drivers willfully exceed speed limits, will soon be mandated in Europe.

Basically, Big Brother is out there, but so far, he's only watching.

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New Dodge Charger SRT Widebody Likely Teased in Brief Video

This morning, we saw a new, extremely brief teaser for a new version of the Dodge Charger SRT. We don't know exactly what the car is, but rumors and spy shots suggest that the big sedan could be getting the same treatment as t h e multiple Dodge Challenger widebody models. The teaser of course cuts just before you can see anything truly telling, but there are a few details we can glean. Hopefully we won't have to wait too long for the full reveal.

The car appears to be painted B5 Blue, one of a number of knockout colors in FCA's portfolio. Through the cover we can see that the car gets the upgraded grille that we saw last summer. A pair of inlets

helps feed more air into the engine bay. The lower intakes on the front bumper appear to be all new and much larger than anything else we've seen on the Charger so far. It's unclear what exactly that means, but it does give an already bold design an even more aggressive appearance.

Over the past couple of years, Dodge revealed widebody versions of the Challenger R/T Scat Pack, Hellcat, Hellcat Redeye and the widebody only Dodge Demon. Each car is faster and more powerful than the last. The bulging fenders allow for a revised suspension setup, wider wheels and tires and a wider track for more stable handling. It makes an

already big car even bigger, though you do get genuine improvements when it comes to performance handling.
