
The Sunliner needed a lot of work and my dad helped me to put things right with a new top and transmission.

I stored the wrecked Sunliner in a series of rented garages and finally shipped it to Spokane 1985 where languished in storage warehouses. 
There was no meeting in May therefore there are no minutes. Plans are in the works for cruises and other activities. More information to come.



Lemon Cupcakes

Cupcakes:

- 3 cups self-rising flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup unsalted butter at room temperature
- 2 cups white sugar
- 4 eggs, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons lemon zest
- 1 cup whole milk, divided
- 2 1/2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice, divided

Lemon Cream Icing

- 2 cups chilled heavy cream
- 3/4 cup confectioner's sugar
- 1 1/2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice



- 1) Preheat the oven to 375° (190 c). Line 30 cupcake pan cups with paper liners
- 2) Sift the self-rising flour and salt together in a bowl. In another bowl, beat the unsalted butter and sugar with an electric mixer until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, beating each egg until incorporated before adding the next. Mix in the vanilla extract and lemon zest.
- 3) Gently beat the flour mixture into the butter mixture, one third at a time, alternating with half the milk and half the lemon juice after each of the first 2 additions of flour. Beat until just combined; do not over mix.
- 4) Fill the prepared cupcake liners with batter 3/4 full, and bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 17 minutes. Let the cupcakes cook in the pans for about 10 minutes before removing them to finish cooling on a rack.
- 5) To make the icing, beat the cream in a chilled bowl with an electric mixer set on Low until the cream begins to thicken. Add the confectioners' sugar and lemon juice, a little at a time, beating after each addition, until icing forms soft peaks, about 5 minutes. Spread on the cooled cupcakes. Refrigerate leftovers.
