

Chili con Carne (foodnetwork.com)

Ingredients:

Deselect All



- 2 1/2 pounds beef chuck, cut into 1 inch cubes
- 2 1/2 pounds pork shoulder, cut into 1 inch cubes
- I tablespoon kosher salt plus more to taste
- 🕑 Freshly ground black pepper
- 🕑 1/3 to 1/2 cup olive oil
- 2 large Spanish onions, chopped
- 🕑 10 large cloves garlic, minced
- 1/4 cup New Mexico red chile powder
- 🥑 2 tablespoons ancho chile powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 2 teaspoons oregano, crushed (preferably Mexican)
- 6 cups beef or chicken broth, homemade or low-sodium canned (see note)
- Two 15 1/2-ounce cans pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- Serving suggestions: White rice, sour cream, chopped cilantro (fresh coriander), shredded cheddar, minced fresh or pickled jalapeno peppers

Directions:

Pat the meat dry with a paper towel and season with the salt and pepper. Heat 2 tablespoons of the oil in a large stew pot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Sear the meat, in small batches, until well browned, adding more oil to the pan if needed. Transfer meat to a bowl and reserve.

2 Discard all but 2 tablespoons of the oil from the pan. Saute the onions over medium heat for 10 minutes, scraping up the browned bits with a wooden spoon from the bottom of the pan. Add the garlic and saute for 2 minutes more. Stir in the chili powders, cumin, and oregano and cook for 2 minutes. Whisk in 5 cups of the stock. Add the meat and any accumulated juices to the pot. Bring to a gentle simmer. Season the chili with salt and pepper to taste, and stew the meat with a cover slightly ajar until almost tender, about 3 hours.

3 In a food processor or blender puree half of the beans with the remaining stock. Add the bean mixture to the chili along with the whole beans. Simmer for 1 hour more or until the meat is tender. Season with salt and pepper to taste and serve with rice and selections of condiments, like sour cream, chopped cilantro, shredded cheddar, minced fresh or sliced pickled jalapenos.

Cook's Note

Try to avoid using canned beef broth because it can give the chili an unpleasant tinny taste. The chili tastes best if made a day a head, refrigerated, and reheated.

1980 Chevy C10 Square-Body Diesel Truck Found in a Field



If we had a time machine that could let us jump onto hot rod trends before they became popular, we would use it to go back and grab up trucks. There was a time when you could pick up classic trucks, especially Chevy C10s, for cheap. These former utilitarian work trucks were great options for gearheads who couldn't afford the admission price of a Camaro, 'Cuda, or Mustang. Well, at some point people figured out that these old work trucks made great hot rods, so the price on the classics from the '60s and early '70s skyrocketed. But hey, that meant we still had the later square-body trucks from the mid-'70s and '80s, right? Well, for a while yeah, but as the supply of older trucks dried up and their prices went up, the squarebody truck prices started marching upward, as well.



With the price and popularity increase, trucks that were once "not worth the time" are now sought after. At Nobody Else's Auto in Great Bend, Kansas, Chad Ehrlich's business is locating forgotten barn and field finds. Sometimes they are for parts, but other times he finds complete rides, ready to be brought back to life. Such is the case with this 1980 Chevy C10 Silverado.



This one was part of a 20-plus -car horde he found parked around a rural Kansas farm. It was bought new in 1980 by the farmer, and when he was done with it, the truck was unceremoniously parked on the edge of the field with all the other castoff farm equipment.

This one is a bit cooler since it was an early diesel half-ton truck. Of course, as is common with many of these early diesels, the engine was swapped out to a gasoline version at some point. The original diesels used an Oldsmobile-block-based engine, so it was switched to an Olds gas engine. Yeah, it's

an Olds gas engine. Yeah, it's marked Buick (most likely from the late '70s or early '80s), but keep in mind that many Buicks used Olds engines from the factory. In any event, it's still titled as a diesel, which can be helpful in strict emissions states like California.

This square-body C10 is a highly optioned truck, so the farmer must have wanted to treat himself to something nice. The truck came from the dealer with power windows and locks, a tilt column, a dash clock, rally wheels, air conditioning, tinted glass, chrome bumpers, an auxiliary fuel tank, and heavy-duty suspension. The farmer added the requisite CB radio and a retrolicious green-tinted bug shield. Put it all together, and it makes for an intact, nearly rust-free field find iust begging for makeover.



If you're in the market for a solid square-body project truck or parts for your current hot rodding endeavor, then be sure to hit up Ehrlich's shop. You can also keep an eye on what new stuff is showing up to Ehrlich's salvage yard, by following him on Facebook (Nobody Else's Auto) or eBay (nobodyselsesauto), and he even has a YouTube channel called Nobody's Show! 



