### Kit DeAndre's Other Passion

This article begins with fate, kismet, or serendipity and goes from there. Sit back, relax and enjoy a glimpse into the fascinating, high-speed, top-fuel world of Kit.



How it all began: A friend and I attended the NHRA Finals in Pomona in 2011, and at a busy burger joint we ran into two guys who had nowhere to sit, so they joined us at our booth outdoors. One of them was a driver, and the other worked the marketing side of Peak Motor Oil and Coolants. Both were in their racing garb and we learned that TJ Zizzo was in the Top Fuel Class - we talked about racing for the next hour. The Top Fuel team did not compete for the complete season, but when they did compete they were very good at qualifying and going rounds. We were invited to come to their camp

the next day to see how this fuel team operated. After Pomona I was able to stay in touch with TJ and the team, and of course I would focus on on the races they entered.

It certainly has been a positive experience being involved in this sport that always has you constantly learning, paying attention, and trying to keep up! One year, at Indianapolis, during a routine chassis inspection a crack was found in an area that needed to be welded with a saddle. The problem was that we didn't have a TIG welder. It was getting late enough that many of the teams had left for the evening. Fortunately we ended up finding one of the Tim Wilkerson guys that was willing to help us solve our problem late into the night.


We are a team of guys who all have regular jobs so we don't do this for a living like the other teams. TJ owns a body shop in the Chicago suburbs, and the other guys find time off to pursue the passion of drag racing and working at getting it done right. We joke about how normally it (any problem with the race car) would pass an inspection with anyone else, but for us it would have to be "Zizzoworthy" or it simply won't do. We strive for perfection in a very difficult sport.

Peak Motor Oil and Coolants has since moved to John Force Racing, and we have had Rust-oleum as our sponsor for the last several years. It works well with the driver owning a body shop where he uses and advertises many of their products.

Some of our cost inputs are interesting: fuel is about \$1,650 for 42 gallons. The car burns about 20 gallons in a warm-up, burnout, and full lap. I recall when the semi was mortgaged and they were trying to race "on a budget" the cost was about \$25,000 per lap.

One last story: Sonoma is an interesting track to get to and from, but that's another story. I had rented a vehicle as a support and tow vehicle for the race car at the track. After a race one weekend we saw a crack in the front wing caused by me putting the car away on Friday evening. A gust of wind blew the rear wing over while being stored (not my fault) it required some carbon fiber repair work. The body shop guys did a good job on the wing. After all of this, as we were leaving the track, the front fender on my rented car was demolished by a semi - not just any semi - but by OUR semi. I think I was told it would cost probably \$3,000 to repair. I recall the damage report listing the cause of the damage as a "rubbed curb" LOL. It was some time before Avis finally got a hold of me and asked for about \$1,200 for the





repair. I couldn't get my wallet out fast enough!

My first car was a 1963 Impala SS with a 327. I hurt the motor one year and took it to Davenport, WA to be repaired. I never saw it again.

I've been a member of the Gents for six years - a great bunch of guys. I am very much looking forward

to hosting the September 20th Shop Tour/Liberty Lake Golf Course car show and barbecue!


